



Nasrin Sotoudeh Langroudi

Nasrin Sotoudeh (45 years old) has studied law in Teheran (Iran) and is today a well known lawyer who has voluntarily represented many women's rights activists, especially those involved in the One Million Signatures Campaign. Sotoudeh is also known for her legal activism on behalf of abused children and under 18 youth sentenced to be executed.

The 12th June eight women were arrested in Teheran, where a seminar was scheduled to take place in honor of the anniversary of the day of solidarity of Iranian women to review the achievements of the women's movements as well on publicizing and popularizing the women's rights demands. The breast-feeding mother Nasrin Sotoodeh who came to assist as a lawyer and defender of human rights was likewise arrested. Meanwhile, also Sotoodeh had been released on bail as a breast-feeding mother; however, she has to stand trial on that matter. Thanks to this price, the sentence of the court could be milder.
